

The Lord's Supper as practiced at ACTS Church Lakeway

Here are some things you might want to know about the Lord's Supper, as practiced at ACTS Church Lakeway:

- Since the Lord's Supper is such a vital part of our Journey of faith, it is offered regularly during the Gatherings of the local church. ACTS Church Lakeway typically celebrates the Lord's Supper on the first and third weekends of each month.
- In Baptism we welcome people of all ages, regardless of circumstances. However, in the Lord's Supper, it is important that each individual be able to perceive the sacrifice of Jesus connected to this Meal (1 Corinthians 11:27-29). Therefore, we ask that only the following individuals take part in the Lord's Supper:
 - those who have been baptized (Acts 2: 37,38);
 - those who recognize and confess their sins (Proverbs 28:13; 1 John 1:8-10);
 - those who believe the body and blood of Jesus is offered under forms of bread and wine (1 Corinthians 10:16; 1 Corinthians 11:27-29);
 - broken people who gratefully accept Jesus' words: "given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins" (Matthew 26:27-28; 9:10-13).
 - Those who are not receiving the Lord's Supper are always invited to come forward to receive a prayer of blessing.
 - Prior to receiving the Lord's Supper for the first time, we ask that children go through a period of instruction. This interactive process takes place at approximately 12 years of age and involves pastor, peer group, and parents. Contact us to learn more.
 - You may drink the wine from either the common cup or from an individual cup. Non-alcoholic wine is available for those with special needs. It can be found in specially-marked sections of the Communion trays.
